Working in partnership with Parks Canada, the Society preserves the history of the BC fishing industry and presents it in an engaging and relevant way. It is open to the public year-round and welcomes visitors from across the Metro Vancouver and around the world.

We are seeking outgoing individuals to join our front-line Heritage Interpreter team, dedicated to providing exemplary customer service in presenting the site and its history to our visitors.

Reporting to the Visitor Services Manager, and working with the Audience Engagement Manager, responsibilities include:

- Assisting with special event activities as required
